

Collin College Things You Need to Know: Checklist for Transfer

- Where do you plan to transfer?
- Do you have a backup plan?
- Have you selected a major?
- Have you visited with a Collin College [academic advisor](#)?
- Do you have a degree plan for the college or university for your chosen major/program (check with an academic advisor, the college catalog, and/or the college website)?
- Are you taking courses that will satisfy the specific requirements for your degree plan—including prerequisites and recommended courses (check the college/university website or check the [Transfer Guides](#) link)?
- Have you checked the [Course Equivalency Tools](#) link to see how your Collin courses will transfer to many colleges/universities?
- Have you checked with an academic advisor or your chosen college/university for any changes or updates to your degree plan?
- If possible, plan to complete your government, math, or science sequence of courses either at Collin College or your transfer college or university. For instance, GOVT 2301 and 2302 (if required, this depends if you are transferring to an out-of state college or university), MATH 2413, 2414, and 2415, etc.
- Do you know that some colleges and universities have limited enrollment and restrictions for transfer students wishing to enroll in highly competitive academic programs?
- Have you checked the [TransferU](#) website for scheduled college/university visits and events?
- Are you aware of tuition costs and the availability of financial aid and scholarships at the college or university you are transferring to?
- Are you aware of opportunities for transfer students in athletics, activities, and support services?
- Do you plan to make a personal visit to tour the college or university?
- Do you need to fill out a housing application for the college or university?
- What is the academic success record or attrition rate for transfer student at your college or university?
- Is there amnesty or a forgiveness clause at the college or university for a poor academic record from years past?

- Do you have a contact person for your major/program area at your transfer college?
- Do you know the [application deadlines](#) for your transfer college or university?
- Do you know the grade point average required for admission to your transfer college or university?
- Are “D” grades accepted at your transfer college or university for admission and/or your intended major?
- Depending on the number of college credit hours being transferred, are your high school transcripts or SAT/ACT scores required for admission.
- Do you know the maximum number of credit hours accepted in transfer to your college or university?
